Celebrant: May we be a Christian community of hospitality and relationships.

People: One Body, one Spirit.

Celebrant: May we hold each other accountable to the ongoing mission of unity as we continue our faith journeys together.

People: One Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all.

Celebrant: May we express a Christian voice of conscience and provide a voice for the voiceless.

People: One Body, one Spirit.

Celebrant: May the mission and ministry of the Body of Christ, united in diversity, be made visible in our land.

People: One Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all.

Celebrant: Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord.

FIRST LESSON

Job 38:1-11

The Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:

"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?

Gird up your loins like a man,
I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth?
Tell me, if you have understanding.

Who determined its measurements—surely you know!
Or who stretched the line upon it?

On what were its bases sunk,
or who laid its cornerstone

when the morning stars sang together
and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?

"Or who shut in the sea with doors
when it burst out from the womb?—

when I made the clouds its garment,
and thick darkness its swaddling band,

and prescribed bounds for it,
and set bars and doors,

and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther,
and here shall your proud waves be stopped'?"

THE RESPONSE:

(Read responsively)

Psalm 107:1-3, 23-32 – Confitemini Domino

1. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, *
and his mercy endures for ever.
2. Let all those whom the Lord has redeemed proclaim *
that he redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
3. He gathered them out of the lands; *
**from the east and from the west,
from the north and from the south.**
23. Some went down to the sea in ships *
and plied their trade in deep waters;
24. They beheld the works of the Lord *
and his wonders in the deep.
25. Then he spoke, and a stormy wind arose, *
which tossed high the waves of the sea.
26. They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths; *
their hearts melted because of their peril.
27. They reeled and staggered like drunkards *
and were at their wits' end.
28. Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, *
and he delivered them from their distress.
29. He stilled the storm to a whisper *
and quieted the waves of the sea.
30. Then were they glad because of the calm, *
and he brought them to the harbor they were bound for.
31. Let them give thanks to the Lord for his mercy *
and the wonders he does for his children.
32. Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people *
and praise him in the council of the elders.

SECOND LESSON

2 Corinthians 6:1-13

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says,

“At an acceptable time I have listened to you,
and on a day of salvation I have helped you.”

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see-- we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return-- I speak as to children-- open wide your hearts also.

THE GOSPEL

MARK 4:35-41

When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, “Let us go across to the other side.” And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Peace! Be still!” Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, “Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?” And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, “Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?”

NICENE CREED

BCP 359

(The people stand and say together)

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

After each prayer, the intercessor and people respond...

People: Hear our prayer.

*(Final prayer ends with) We pray in the name of Jesus, the cornerstone
of our spiritual temple and the head of our spiritual body.*

People: Amen

CONFESSION OF SIN & ABSOLUTION

BCP 359

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

**People: Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
In thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

People: Amen.

THE PEACE

BCP 360

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

*Due to social distancing,
please wave and express the peace via safe means*

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

BCP 367

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth...*(the celebrant adds a preface)*...

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

People: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of you glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: *(The Celebrant gives thanks to God for the reconciling work of Christ's passion and resurrection and prays over the bread and wine.)*

Therefore, according to his command, O Father:

People: We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory;

Celebrant: *(The celebrant continues with a prayer, concluding...)*

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: And now as Christ has taught us we now pray,

All: **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those
who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

THE BREAKING OF BREAD

BCP 364

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

INVITATION

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

(The people are seated)

Our table is open. All are welcome to come forward. All those baptized in any Christian tradition are welcome to receive the elements. Those not wishing to receive may come forward for a blessing. Please cross your arms to receive a blessing.

The Bread and Wine are given to the communicants with these words

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. **AMEN**

The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. **AMEN**
